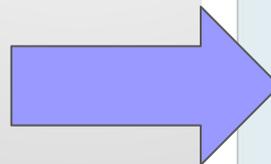
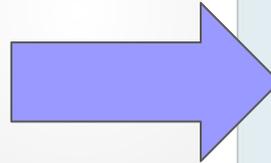
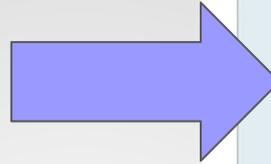

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*Enrollment in these programs is limited due to physical classroom space and teacher availability. For example, 1 auto teacher = only 6 periods of auto in the entire year spread across 3 grades. **If you can't choose it because it is full in myBp, you can add it in as an alternate choice.**

Students are able to select one **ONE leadership course. If interested, you must choose either Business Leadership (BOH) or Recreation Leadership (PLF).

Step 4: Know All of the Options You Have

- Some ENROLLMENT LIMITS are in place for classes that are limited by **space, equipment and teacher availability** (**ALL** tech classes)
- You are familiar with this from grade 10 and 11. It is okay...**it all worked out, remember?**
- If the class you want has reached the enrollment limit, it will say the course is **“no longer available”**
- If you get this message, you must select a different course at course selection time, then **choose this course as an alternate**
- Follow up with google form to declare the tech you need/want

What is OYAP?

(ONTARIO YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM)

The **Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program** offers students the opportunity to begin an apprenticeship while still in secondary school. Students must be at least 16 years old and have completed 16 credits towards their OSSD.

- Students in a Cooperative Education placement in an apprenticeable trade are considered OYAP students.
- Students may be signed as an apprentice while at their Coop placement.

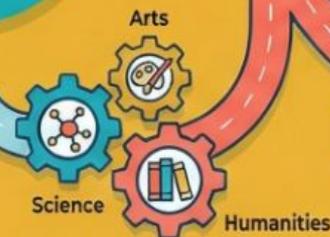

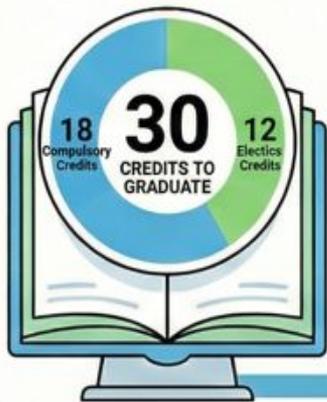
