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- iii. Student Engagement Survey was shared with positive student engagement results, overall. Important to note students remained challenged to maintain focus during emergency remote learning.
- b. 2021.22: School Calendar Information
 - i. New calendar for next school year has 3 PD days prior to school with 2 of them after Labour Day Holiday. The first day of school would be on Thursday, September 9, 2021. The Friday before March Break 2022 is lost in this new schedule.
 - ii. Currently, the school year is planned to start with Quadmesters for semester 1, with the hope to return to a 4-course semester 2 and more normalcy than now.
- c. 2021.22: School Planning Information
 - i. Planning for next year's startup will be the same quadmester and bell schedule as our current pandemic situation, using Cohort system with in-person and online learning, plus academic support. As public health protocols evolve, adjusting to the health pandemic, so, too, will the education system.
 - ii. Learning preferences survey was issued due to the demand for online learning across the system. At Brooklin HS the impact has been approximately 40 more students preferring to attend virtual, only, making our enrolment 1,340, currently.
 - iii. The school timetable process has just begun and may not be set until late June 2021. There may have to be adjustments made in August as enrolment numbers evolve.
 - iv. There is no information about return to school for the remainder of this school year. For now, it is a provincial shutdown until May 20th, 2021. Updates are likely forthcoming – when or if we will be returning to in person learning.
