Communication is KEY

- Mirror communication this year with what it will look like/feel like/sound like **next year** and the years moving forward
- **When your child turns 18, the DDSB will no longer communicate with you unless we have the child's permission to do so – including report cards, transcript requests, educational information.**
- Encourage your child to **take the lead** but still be involved and aware
- They need to check often the portals that are used for communication – **ignorance is not an excuse**
- Self-advocacy and awareness are very important

Online Learning Graduation Requirement Opt-Out Form

About the online learning graduation requirement

Students are required to earn two online learning credits to graduate from secondary school, beginning with every student who entered Grade 9 in the 2020-21 school year.

The ministry recognizes the extraordinary circumstances of the COVID-19 pandemic. (As a result, up to one secondary school credit completed by Grade 9 students in the 2020-2021 school year during the province-wide school closures (from April 2021 to June 2021) will be counted towards the graduation requirement).

Adult learners entering the Ontario secondary school system in 2023-24 or later will be required to meet this graduation requirement and may opt themselves out of the requirement. The graduation requirement is intended to support students in developing familiarity and comfort with working and learning in a fully online environment, as well as developing digital literacy and other important transferable skills that will help prepare them for success after graduation and in all aspects of their lives.

Meeting the online learning graduation requirement should not pose a barrier to graduation for students. As with all learning, students taking online courses will have access to the supports they need through their school, (e.g., guidance, nutrition programs, extra-curricular activities and services for English-language learners). If a student in a publicly funded school has an Individual Education Plan, the plan should be shared, when appropriate, with an educator instructing an online course delivered by another publicly funded school board, with the necessary consent.

Parents/guardians may choose to opt their child out of the mandatory online courses required for graduation. Students age 18 years of age or older or students who are 16 or 17 years of age and have withdrawn from parental control can also opt out of the graduation requirement. School boards must also allow for students and parents/guardians to opt back into the online learning graduation requirement should their decision change.

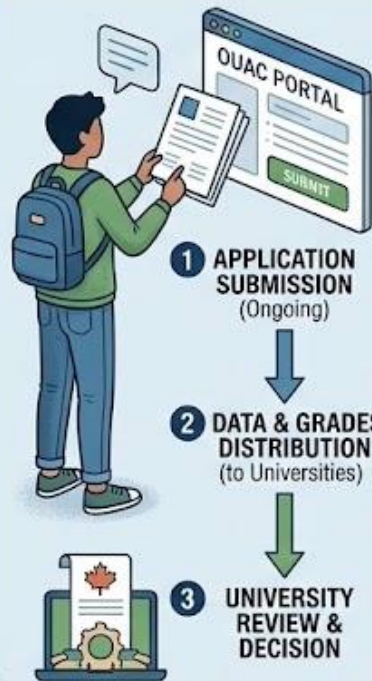
Early AdmiSSion...my least favourite two words together

- ❑ Yes, early admission exists at Ontario universities, **but** it does not work like the "Early Decision" system in the United States.
- ❑ Instead of a separate application track, Ontario uses a **rolling admission process**. You **apply once** through the [Ontario Universities' Application Centre \(OUAC\)](#), and universities evaluate your file in **multiple waves as new grades become available**
- ❑ They will never say NO right now based on anything...they might flag your application or put you in a maybe or yes category...but it will never be a no until it is a no (last day to hear is May 28th).
- ❑ **You most likely will hear sooner from COLLEGES vs. UNIVERSITIES**

- Once your payment has been made, OCAS or OUAC will **automatically** send your application information to your post-secondary school choices
- **You do NOT need to request transcripts from BHS – the DDSB sends automatically and you don't need to tell me you applied...although you can – check after I tell you they have been uploaded!**

Timing of Information to OUAC/OCAS:

- October – Demographic info and grade 11 marks to OUAC/OCAS
- November – S1 Midterm marks to OUAC/OCAS
- February – S1 Final marks to OUAC/OCAS
- April – S2 Midterm marks to OUAC/OCAS

- **Admissions formulas** are individual and are based on program, applicant interest, availability, etc.
