

  - 1. 314 First time writers (266 Academic, 46 Applied, 2 locally developed, 59 IEP)

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- 2. 85% success rate overall (applied, academic, IEP and gender based data reviewed as well.)
- 3. BHS focus will be on our applied level students for these students achieved a 49% success rate
- 4. Literacy Plans the committee met and discussed where we move forward. After two years of small group lessons, we will change tactics to address the applied and male challenges our school seems to be having. Discipline based literacy lessons will be moving forward with more vigor. Also, media Mondays will be run to address the challenges of that skill. In the spring more prescribed literacy activities will be delivered in preparation leading up to the test itself.
- ii. Numeracy Results
  - 1. Academic students are doing very well with 91% success rate, while Applied level students continue to struggle at 41%. The past four years at BHS reflect a similar trend locally and provincially.
  - 2. With Gr 9 Math Applied level teachers get Board support as well as professional development in house to collaborate on lessons. After School Numeracy is run in the library beginning in November and will be of great assistance for students.
